## **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

The Department of Workforce Services (DWS) partners with the Office of Apprenticeship. Registered Apprenticeship is a formalized, structured training program. It combines on-the-job training that as an employer, you provide your employees, and related technical instruction in which paid employees receive practical and technical training in a highly skilled occupation. Apprenticeship is industry-driven career training. Industry determines the skills that are essential to sustain a quality workforce.

Apprenticeships can last from one to six years (occupation dependent). Most of them average three to four years. During this time, apprentices work and learn under the direction of your experienced journey workers. Over time, apprentices are provided the diversity and complexity of training that leads to becoming highly skilled in their chosen occupations. As they gain skill, they become more productive and profitable, and are compensated through an increase in wages.

When individuals complete a Registered Apprenticeship program, they will possess the skills, knowledge, and experience needed to succeed in their chosen occupation. They will be more profitable for you, the employer. They will also possess a nationally-recognized Certificate of Completion of Apprenticeship from the U.S. Department of Labor.
